- ☐ "On-time Completion Rate" is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- ☐ "150% Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates).
- ☐ "150% Completion Rate" is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- ☐ "Graduates Available for Employment" means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.
- ☐ "Graduates Unavailable for Employment" means the graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.
- ☐ "Graduates Employed in the Field" means graduates who beginning within six months after a student completes the applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for whom the institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the six months period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student completes an applicable educational program.
- ☐ "Placement Rate Employed in the Field" is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.
- ☐ "Number of Graduates Taking Exam" is the number of graduates who took the first available exam in the reported calendar year.

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- ☐ "First Available Exam Date" is the date for the first available exam after a student completed a program.
 - ☐ "Passage Rate" is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who passed the exam by the number of graduates who took the reported licensing exam.
 - ☐ "Number Who Passed First Available Exam" is the number of graduates who took and passed the first available licensing exam after completing the program.

STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

The student has a right to cancel or change this Financial Agreement and obtain a refund of charges under the following provisions. The student must fill out the **Change of Status Form** to cancel or change this Financial Agreement and deliver it to the college either in person or by certified mail prior to the appropriate deadlines. Refund or credit of all charges and fees, except application fee and registration fee, will apply upon full withdrawal and notification prior to the first day of class. In addition, the student may drop a class after the first session and receive a pro-rated refund or credit to their account for the unused portion of the tuition, all fees will be applicable. ***The student may NOT drop a class after the second session.*** A student may withdraw completely from EPIC Bible College and Graduate School after instruction has begun through the end of the fourth week of class (60%) and receive a pro-rated refund or credit to their account of the unused portion of tuition, all fees will be applicable. For example, if the student is enrolled in only one 4-unit course and completes 16 hours of the 40-hour/4-unit course and paid \$996.00 tuition, then withdraws at the end of the fourth week, \$332.00 will be refunded or credited to the student's account. **In order to receive a refund a student must provide written notice to the Director of Records at *EPIC Bible College and Graduate School, 4330 Auburn Blvd., Sacramento, CA 95841.*** Pro-ration will be based on the date that EPIC receives the written request or the date on the certified mail. Refunds shall be paid upon written request within 30 days of cancellation. Any balance still owing by the student will be due and payable at the time of withdrawal. If the college cancels or discontinues a course or educational program, the college will make a full refund or credit of all charges related to that course, including fees and books.

If a student has received Federal Student Financial Aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund of moneys not paid from the Federal Student Financial Aid program funds.

If the student obtains a loan to pay for an educational program, the student will have the responsibility to repay the full amount of the loan plus interest, less the amount of any refund.

If a student is eligible for a loan guaranteed by the federal or state government and the student defaults on the loan, both of the following may occur:

1. The federal or state government or a loan guarantee agency may take action against the student, including applying any income tax refund to which the person is entitled, to reduce the balance owed on the loan.
2. The student may not be eligible for any other government financial assistance at another institution until the loan is repaid.
